

LATVIA NORTHERN GAUJA FORESTLAND



GAUJIENA - TRAPENE, 21 km

Along Latvia's longest larch alley to Trapene

The stretch of road between Gaujiena and Līzespasts leads through remote forests, surrounded by large swamps. Mežciems is the only settlement here, and there are no solitary homesteads. Further along, the 5 km walk from Līzespasts to Trapene features open agricultural landscapes with lush meadows and landscapes typical of western Alūksne hillocks. About half of these 5 km lead through the breath-taking Trapene larch alley.

Mainly gravel roads. Paved road in the section between Līzespasts and Trapene.


Easy

The road through Trapene larch alley is narrow and winding, so be careful and observe safety rules!

The only shops are located at the starting and end points.
No places to eat between
Strenči and Ape.

Līzespasts-Trapene section can be travelled by bus (in the evening).





FORESTS

From Gaujiena, the Forest Trail winds along several large swamps: Melnsala, Sloka, Kaulezers and Tetersala, with "Paris" in the middle (some time ago, a baron who lived on this side loved name the houses of his gamekeepers after European cities). The common buzzard and other birds of prey are often spotted in the area. There are various specially protected habitats here: bogs, mires, old or naturally boreal (northern) forests, old mixed broadleaf forests. There is a protected European larch alley near Trapene, and many trees in the alley have reached formidable size. The alley is particularly important for maintaining the diversity of various insect species.

The most spectacular larch tree alley in Latvia is located on the Līzespasts–Bormaņmuiža road.

Baron Wulf's Bormanmuiža Estate.
Since 1934, the building houses the
Trapene People's House, now the Culture

Centre. A monument to writer Linards Laicens is erected by the Culture Centre. GPS: 57.44949, 26.59496

Trapene Local Heritage House.

Part of the exposition is dedicated to the local author and poet Ojārs Vācietis. You can listen to recordings of the poet reciting his own poems.
